WHO WILL MAKE THE TOP FIVE?

After seven rounds of the AFL Sydney Premier Division competition there are seven teams within one win of top spot which illustrates the evenness of the competition.

Round seven saw the wet weather arrive and North Shore suffer their second consecutive loss by less than 10 points, as East Coast Eagles returned to the winners list. Pennant Hills, who despite inaccurate kicking, showed their potential with a big win over top-of-the-table Western Suburbs at Ern Holmes Oval. St George with six Under 18s players recorded their fourth win on the trot accounting for the loveless Campbelltown at Monarch Oval. Sydney University won the battle of the Universities defeating UNSW/ES at Village Green whilst in the final game Wollongong recorded their first win of the season defeating Balmain Dockers, despite former Swan Nick Davis kicking ten goals.

This weekend is another significant event on the AFL Sydney calendar when arch rivals East Coast Eagles and Pennant Hills lock horns in "Back to Baulko" day at Bruce Purser Reserve. No love is lost between these two clubs and they have fought numerous tough battles in the past. Both sides enter the match in good form and a big crowd is expected under lights.

Arguably the two form sides in the competition, Sydney University and St George will meet at Sydney University on Sunday. The Students currently sit in equal top position and have three wins together whilst St George have the longest winning streak in the league at present with four wins, although Sydney Uni will provide the biggest test to the youthful Dragons.

North Shore will be keen to return to the winners list when they host Campbelltown. The Bombers were flying high, unbeaten after five round, but now have dropped their past two matches to Western Suburbs and East Coast Eagles. Campbelltown on the other hand have mixed their form after a big away win against East Coast Eagles followed by a home loss to St George. At Henson Park, Western Suburbs and Wollongong will meet with the Magpies looking to return to the winners list after last week's loss to Pennant Hills. The last game between these two sides was a draw and Wollongong will be looking to go one step better and make it back to back wins.

The final game is at Drummoyne Oval where the winless Balmain Dockers take on UNSW/ES who need to win to keep in touch with the top five. Key recruit Nick Davis was in top form last week and the Bulldogs will need to restrict him if they are to get the points.

Going one step further

LAST YEAR'S FINALS DEFEAT FOR THE WESTERN SUBURBS IS BEING USED AS THE DRIVING FORCE THIS YEAR AS THE CLUB VIES FOR THE ULTIMATE PRIZE - GRAND FINAL GLORY. THE CLUB PRESIDENT, ANDREW TAYLOR, REFLECTS ON THE SEASON THUS FAR AND WHERE THE MAGPIES ARE HEADING IN THE FUTURE...

How is the club placed this season?

We have a large group of senior and experienced players, and we feel we've improved on that in the off-season, so we're definitely looking at winning the whole lot this year. We were a little disappointed about the way things finished last year given the first big win in the final and then to go out with two losses after that, was fairly disappointing and we're certainly using that as motivation this year.

How much of a driving force is last year's finals exit?

We've got a few of our stars who are coming towards the end of their careers and I think there's a real mindset to win something before those careers come to an end. That's what's driving the club.

What areas does the side need to work on?

We definitely feel that at the start of the year we really needed to bolster our midfield and we think we've done that. Just having our home ground redeveloped and to train and play on that is going to be the biggest thing that's going to be in our favour.

What do you believe the side is doing well this season?

I think we're a very strong side up the middle, we're a very big bodied side all over the ground and we pride ourselves on playing a tough tackling and full contact game and that's where our strengths lie. Just the history of our club that we have behind us, we see that as our main strength.

Which aspects of the clubs history is the main strength?

The history of the great teams and players that have been at the club and just how successful the club

was in the 1960's and 1970's has really set out club up as a force. We've got a licensed club and we see ourselves as a very big club and we like to carry ourselves that way.

What individual players have impressed thus far in the year?

We've had some good junior players coming through, we've got Brenton Mumme who played last year and came fourth in the best and fairest as an under-18, he's probably the standout. We've got Jack Barret whose played every game this year and is from the under-18s. We've also got Marcus Linson who has played just about every game who has also stepped up this year. I think we've got the best player in the league in Matt Withers and he continues to be a great target for us, as well as Matt Eurell.

How encouraging is it to see the number of junior players making the step-up to seniors?

It is encouraging because we don't really have a pathway. We're competing against clubs like North Shore, Pennant Hills and St George who have six to eight junior teams feeding into their senior side and we only have one. We have a very reduced pathway and we're always punching above our weight.

Are your sponsors a driving force in the club going forward?

Our sponsors are vital to our existence. We've got a great relationship with Westbet and they've been fantastic in sponsoring us for the second year. We've also got a great relationship with Elders real-estate and they've been terrific. Abbots Locks have been heavily involved in the club for at least 30 or 40 years and they're fantastic.

RAMS OFF TO A FLYING START

The NSW/ACT RAMS have kicked off their 2010 NAB AFL Under-18s campaign with an emphatic 41-point victory over Northern Territory at Blacktown Olympic Park on Saturday.

The RAMS got off to a blistering start, having ten scoring shots in the opening quarter to lead at the first change by 21 points.

The RAMS were led by a standout performance from North Albury's Anthony Miles who racked up 43-disposals and three goals, including a number of contested possessions.

Josh Bruce was also prominent for the RAMS booting five goals, while Wade Hancock and Kaine Stevens kicked two goals each.

Northern Territory's Steven May sparked a second term revival with the forward kicking four goals for the game before RAMS' Tim Segrave curbed his influence in the second half.



UMPIRING

The AFL Sydney Umpire group is pleased to this week profile Boundary Umpire Coach – Stewart (Chook) Eckermann.

The role and impact of Stewart on so many umpires' lives is truly immeasurable. The thing that sets him apart from others, is his ability to engender a feeling of comradeship and teamwork within the boundary umpiring ranks. To Stewart, it makes no difference if you are new to boundary umpiring or an old war horse he delivers same level of commitment to your fitness, welfare and training and is often seen spending time with umpires perfecting their skills.

Another thing that epitomises Stewart's commitment to the boundary umpiring group is his dedication and support on game days. He is often seen running around the outside of football ovals all over Sydney providing encouragement and advice – the truth is that he probably runs further than the officiating boundary umpires! The Eckermann family have a rich history in Sydney football, with Stewart's father being an umpire and a member of the Umpires Association executive for many years.

Over a period of 15 years, Stewart has officiated in over 100 AFL Sydney games so when he finally decided to retire it was a natural transition into a coaching role. In addition to his role as coach with the AFL Sydney Umpires, Stewart is also the AFL Boundary Umpires Coach and takes great pride in the success of the Sydney based AFL boundary umpires. He is also very optimistic about the future of boundary umpiring, as a number of junior umpires are emerging through the ranks.

How long have you been umpiring and what grades? My knees would say I started in 1742 but I started officially started in 1995 - Premier Division mostly. I retired in 2006 and since then have been coaching boundary umpires.

The commitment needed to umpire – what sacrifices do you make to umpire every week? They never seemed like sacrifices to me. I was happy to be umpiring; I enjoyed the focus it gave to my life.

What has been your great achievement?

I have not achieved it yet, but my greatest achievement will be to have coached Sydney based boundary umpires into the AFL.




Another big round of matches facing the Bats this week.

He is well known and respected by the Sydney AFL fraternity and well known to most, if not all spectators. All associated with football in Sydney have appreciated Frank's open and friendly discussions both on and off the field. His relationships with various senior clubs ties back to his early playing days with North Shore.

Frank has been umpiring in the Sydney AFL for 27 years, and he has continued to maintain the high standards he has set over such a long period of time. Frank is known for his quality and consistency in decision making, which does not waiver in any circumstances. Frank is also a valued Life Member of the NSW Australian Football Umpires Association, which he was awarded in 1996.

Frank could not know, as a teacher at Christian Brothers' Manly, that when he was asked to play for Seaforth and umpire in the North Shore juniors in 1978, that it would start him on such an illustrious umpiring career. Frank began



Frank's consistently good form and extensive understanding of the game have seen him become a Sydney favourite on either side of the boundary line. When asked why he still enjoys putting in all the hard work needed to stay at the top of umpiring, he replied that "the enthusiasm of the umpiring group is great, and has developed significantly in recent years with Graham Glassford at the helm - and to maintain my fitness."

Frank is a teacher by trade at Santa Sabina College, where he and football are often discussed in the corridors (his wife Jane is the school principal). Frank is currently enjoying being 'Mister Mum' at home due to taking some extended leave, and is enjoying his time away to let him attend to all those household chores that he has never previously had the time to do.
