
Bendigo Bombers v Collingwood

The Pioneers - who have won just one of their 14 games so far this year - don't have the money to offer scholarships to help entice players to move to Bendigo.

In contrast, there are three players – Kerang's Troy Davis at the Geelong Falcons, and Hopetoun pair Coleman Schache and Lucas Cook at North Ballarat – who hail from Bendigo's region, but are playing for rival teams as they are boarding in regional cities renowned for having strong schoolbased football programs.

"Troy Davis would be the centre half-back in our side; he is a quality player who has played Vic Country,' Byrne said.

"When we played North Ballarat earlier in the year. Lucas Cook kicked six goals against us and was the difference. Then you've got Coleman Schache, who was in the Vic Country squad as well.

"So if you put those three into our team, it doesn't take much... we've got kids playing centre half-forward and centre half-back who should be playing on a half-forward and half-back flank.

"A lot of people say to me about these kids who are going to the colleges in Ballarat, 'why don't you make them play with you?

"But it's not fair on the kid. He's boarding, and we're only going to get him for eight games or so a year because of the way those colleges play their footy, so it's not fair on those kids.

"I don't have a problem with the kids going to colleges over there because we just can't afford to give them a scholarship.

And as each year goes on, the Pioneers are finding it increasingly difficult to find host families to accommodate those players who live far from Bendigo.

The challenges also involve dealing with the tyranny of distance, with the Pioneers' region stretching from Kyneton to Mildura to Echuca.

With players spread so far apart, the Pioneers only get their entire squad together one night a week, on a Wednesday.

"Whereas you have the Melbournebased sides that train together three nights a week; they are just like a league side," Byrne said.

"So that's another of the things we're up against.

"But the bottom line for us is we're about the draft, players going on and playing with the Bendigo Bombers or another VFL club, and then players going back to the Bendigo Football League.

"If you go through the BFL and look at the list of names who have come through the Pioneers that we've brought to town... there has been a stack of them who have come through over the years; nearly all the BFL clubs would have kids who have come through the Pioneers.

"When we have kids go back to their club during the season if we have a bye, you can see they're not out of place in senior footy.

Golden Square's Tom Paterson. South Bendigo's Jayke Barrack and Sandhurst's Anthony Dennis have all shown that in the BFL in recent

And don't forget Sandhurst on-baller Lee Coghlan, who last year won the Michelsen Medal as an 18-year-old, having played for the Pioneers in 2008.

"Lee was a great player for us, and to be honest, I get as big a kick out of Lee achieving something like that as I do with players being drafted,' Byrne said.

"When I was with Gippsland, I took great pride in watching players who had played with the Power during the year go back and get best on ground in grand finals with their home clubs.

"As long as the kids get the best out of themselves while they are with us, that's all you can ask for.
