

FROM THE DESK...

WAYNE HOLDSWORTH, SFL BOARD MEMBER



The Southern Football League (SFL) is one of the first senior metropolitan sporting leagues in Australia to roll out automated external defibrillators (AEDs) to all its venues. AED machines deliver electric impulses to victims of cardiac arrest and can significantly increase survival rates of heart attacks occurring away from a hospital. The decision to purchase the machines was ratified by the SFL Board this week, in a move that will see the machines available and training delivered prior to Round 4. "With research showing that sudden cardiac arrest kills between 23,000 and 33,000 Australians each year, the risk is significant and we have a duty of care to our most precious resource – our people" said SFL CEO Wayne Holdsworth. "That includes players, coaching staff, umpires and even spectators. Everyone in the local community can be a

beneficiary of this program." "The incident involving a Skye Football Club player three weeks ago certainly highlighted the importance for us, as a league, to act quickly and definitively" continued Holdsworth. The 39 year old man suffered a cardiac arrest whilst playing for Skye Football Club and remains in a serious condition in hospital. Whilst Skye and Dingley trainers did an incredible job and may well have saved his life, it is the view of experts that access and use of an automatic defibrillator machine may have assisted in greatly improving the outcome for the man. The SFL will underwrite the purchase of a Defibrillator for every SFL venue that does not already have a machine. The machines will be sourced from "Defib Your Club For Life", which was founded in memory of Stephen Buckman, a 19 year old Rupertswood footballer who

died whilst training in May 2010. A non-profit organisation, "Defib Your Club For Life" recognise the need to implement public access defibrillators across Victoria following a spate of similar collapses at other sporting venues. "The success of defibrillators being available in public spaces is very well documented" said Holdsworth. "At the MCG there is a survival rate of 85% of people who experience a sudden cardiac arrest compared to 7 – 10% chance elsewhere in our Australian communities. The difference is that automatic defibrillators are available at the MCG." The SFL will work together with local Councils and other sporting clubs using facilities where the league defibrillators are installed, to ensure the maximum benefit of the machine's use.

DIVISION 1: FROM THE BOUNDARY

Round 2 of the Division One season will be remembered for some ripping matches, but it will mostly be remembered for one man: The Trav. 209-game former AFL star Travis Johnstone has a rich family history at Chelsea Heights and is now the club's number 1 ticket-holder. In a huge coup for the SFL, he made a one-off appearance for the Heighsters' senior squad this week.

Boosted by the presence of The Trav, Chelsea Heights made it two from two against Hightett in a dour struggle at Beazley Reserve. Johnstone had a solid impact with 29 classy possessions as the Heighsters flexed their muscle late to record a 35-point win over the gallant Dogs. Chelsea clicked into top gear when it mattered, thrilling the home crowd with a five-goals-to-nil final term. Deano Stearnes was sensational for the victors, while Jayden Attard led from the front with two goals.

After a youthful St Kilda City side was defeated in Round 1, the Saints received a big injection of experienced star-power in their clash with Dingley at Souter Oval. 2011 Division One best-and-fairest Ezra Poyas returned to the side on permit, and surprise surprise, was promptly named best-on-ground in St Kilda's 13-point victory. Poyas kicked three majors, Lachie Huntington bagged four and Gary Johnstone had another cracker as the Saints held the Dingoes at arm's length for most of the game.

It was a bloodbath for Mordialloc at Jack Barker Oval, as they ran into a brick wall from Cheltenham. The very inexperienced Bloods were no match for the Rosellas, completely dominated throughout to the tune of 89 points. The Rosellas have now established themselves firmly

at the top of the ladder with two percentage-boosting thrashings. Jarrad Martin goes from strength to strength, while Marty Gurry booted six sausage rolls. Mordialloc's VAFA recruits Andrew Scafidì and Sam Anstey showed good signs.

It won't heal all the scars, but it'll go some of the way... East Brighton reversed their Grand Final defeat to St Pauls with a gritty nine-point win on the Doggies' home turf. The arch rivals lit up McKinnon Reserve with a contest that remained intensely close throughout. Yet again it was Dean Francis starring for East Brighton with four goals, but Andrew Jansen and Matthew O'Rourke also played major parts in dragging the Vamps over the line. Owen Lewis was huge for St Pauls with four goals of his own and you can rest assured the Doggies didn't lose an ounce of respect in another classic chapter of this rivalry.

The black and white were triumphant at Meade Reserve on Sunday, but it wasn't the stripes of the visiting Heatherton squad. Clayton exploded out of the blocks at home, going to quarter time 46 points up on the stunned Turnners. Heatherton steadied as the match progressed, eventually going down by 38, but the damage had been done. The Clays are now on the board for 2012, behind seven big goals from best-on-ground Aaron Purvus.

HIGHTETT VS DINGLEY

Hightett returns to Turner Road this week to face a Dingley squad smarting after a tight loss to St Kilda. The Dingoes look much-improved this season and will fancy their chances of establishing themselves in the top half of the ladder. The Doggies will need another big performance from playing coach Trent McMicking and brother Simon

to notch their first win, but it looks unlikely.

ST KILDA CITY VS CLAYTON

Another interesting one at the Peanut Farm between two sides with lists on the up. Clayton didn't have a lot of success against St Kilda in 2011, but the wheels are turning at Meade Reserve. Whether they can stop the Saints' pillars of Gary Johnstone, Myles Quinn and Max Bruin might be the difference.

HEATHERTON VS ST PAULS

You have to feel sorry for the Turnners in this one. The Doggies may feel the effects of their epic loss to the Vampires, but will be even hungrier to return to winners' list at Ross Street. Quite simply, it's hard to see the Heatherton engine room matching it with the likes of Barnes, Allen, Lewis, Wilson and Knox.

EAST BRIGHTON VS MORDIALLOC

Could be another ugly one... The Vampires would be nigh on unbackable to take the languishing Bloods to the cleaners at Hurlingham Park. This match would be just what the doctor ordered for East Brighton after the bruising Grand Final rematch last week. For Mordialloc, there'll be no better test for their inexperienced line-up than to take on this powerhouse.

CHELSEA HEIGHTS VS CHELTENHAM

Game of the round, without question. The Trav may have departed Beazley Reserve, but Cheltenham still has to come to town and face the rest of the rampaging Chelsea Heights outfit. Both teams are undefeated and both teams would fancy themselves to push into the upper echelons of Division One this season. This might sort out which club is the big contender. Bring it on!




