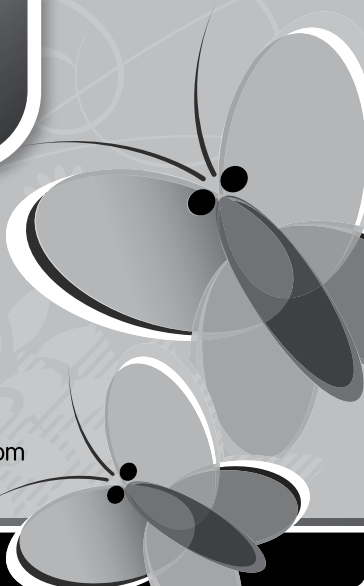

Future Arrangements for Football in Country Victoria

The Board of the WorkSafe Victorian Country Football League (VCFL) is pleased to announce its support for the reforms to the administration and structure of football in country Victoria recently announced by AFL Victoria. The reforms seek to implement recommendations made in the 2011 'Review of Football in Country Victoria' (the Review).

The VCFL Board believes the proposed reforms are a positive move, in the best interests of football in country Victoria and represent an efficient and effective structure for the future administration of football in country Victoria.

Background - The Review

In May 2011 AFL Victoria announced a review of country football in Victoria. The VCFL was one of a number of organisations consulted as part of this review. The findings of the Review were released on 13 October 2011.

One of the key recommendations of the Review was consolidation of the administrative structure that applies to country football in Victoria. Among other things, the Review recommended increased locally based resources and the establishment of local administration hubs, including the establishment of Regional Commissions. This is a significant departure from the current administrative structure for country football.

The VCFL Board has been kept updated on the proposed implementation of the Review and AFL Victoria's overall strategy for the development and management of football in country Victoria.

The VCFL Board wishes to acknowledge its appreciation for the professional and thorough consultation which has taken place since the announcement of the Review last year, in particular, the work undertaken by the Steering Committee, made up of representatives of country football, and the Project Team, which involved representatives of the VCFL, AFL Victoria and AFL.

Decision of the VCFL Board

Following consideration of the findings of the Review and extensive consultation with VCFL Affiliates, other VCFL stakeholders and AFL Victoria, the Board has resolved to support the proposed reforms and the introduction of a Regional Commissions structure.

New arrangements

From 1 November 2012 onwards AFL Victoria intends to undertake various changes to the administration of football in country Victoria, including: increased locally based resources: locally based staff will be appointed to support Leagues and Clubs; locally based Regional Commissions: new locally based independent Regional Commissions will be established. The officeholders of the Regional Commissions will be 'local people'.

The Regional Commissions will be responsible for making strategic decisions in the best interests of football in particular regions. The Regional Commissions will also assist in the management and direction of locally based resources to ensure effective outcomes and greater support for local Leagues and Clubs.

The Regional Commissions will play a significant role in developing even stronger relationships with key football stakeholders, including government, councils, developers, corporate partners and other organisations involved in the delivery of football to country people.

Impact on VCFL and its Affiliates

Following the introduction of the proposed reforms, the VCFL will continue to have a role to play in the administration and support of country football in Victoria.

During 2013 the VCFL will: continue to service its members in conjunction with AFL Victoria through an integrated organisational structure. The services currently offered by the VCFL will continue to be delivered to VCFL Members through or at the direction of the VCFL; continue to affiliate with Leagues, Umpiring Associations and Clubs; maintain its existing commercial and licensing arrangements; and manage the VCFL's retained earnings through the VCFL Board.

For example, the sum of \$500,000 will be made available to the Country Football Netball Program. The VCFL Board will also make further funds available for a Football Infrastructure Program, managed by the VCFL Board. Affiliates will be entitled to apply to the VCFL for funding under that program.

The VCFL also intends to update its branding. This will involve changes to the name and logo used by VCFL's Affiliates, licensees and sponsors. This rebranding program has not been finalised, however the VCFL will be in a position to make a further announcement on this project prior to 1 November 2012.

Going forward the VCFL will consider and implement arrangements to ensure that the needs of its members are met, and act to grow and develop football in country Victoria.

Additional affiliation arrangements during 2013

During 2013: the Regional Commissions will offer affiliations to Leagues, Umpiring Associations and Clubs. These affiliations are supplementary to VCFL Affiliation. The joint affiliation arrangements will not result in Leagues, Clubs or Umpiring Associations having to pay affiliation fees greater than the level of the VCFL affiliation fees in 2012. Player and Umpire Registration fees will continue to be paid to the VCFL.

The VCFL encourages Leagues, Umpiring Associations and Clubs to take up these additional affiliations, in addition to its ongoing affiliation with the VCFL.

Under the new structure the Regional Commissions will be affiliated directly with AFL Victoria. It is presently proposed that thirteen Regional Commissions will operate in 2013. In areas that are not serviced by these Regional Commissions, AFL Victoria will offer affiliation directly with Leagues and Umpiring Associations. Again, this affiliation will be in addition to affiliation with the VCFL and the VCFL encourages Leagues and Umpiring Associations to take up this affiliation.

Summary

The VCFL Board strongly believes the new structures and arrangements proposed by AFL Victoria are in the best interests of country football, and looks forward to those reforms assisting in the development and growth of football in country Victoria.

The VCFL Board wishes to thank VCFL staff members for their dedicated and professional attitude and assistance in continuing to service VCFL Members since the announcement of the Review.

The Board also wishes to acknowledge the ongoing support of its commercial partners and licensees. Those organisations have been updated by the VCFL on the proposed structures and developments, and are supportive of the VCFL Board's approach.

VCFL staff will be visiting many areas of country Victoria over forthcoming weeks and are available to discuss these matters further with its Affiliates. Alternatively, if you have any further questions please don't hesitate to contact either Nicholas Rolfe or Steven Reaper directly.

Stingrays bow out of TAC Cup premiership race

The Dandenong Southern Stingrays TAC Cup season is over after a disappointing 46 point loss in the semi final against the perennially strong Oakleigh Chargers at Visy park, Carlton last Sunday, bowing out in straight sets after finished 3rd.

The game started at an exceptionally high in standard with both teams full of potential AFL draftees. Dandenong, buoyed by missing the week off following a massive turnaround loss to Gippsland Power in the first week of the finals, looked out of their depth early after Oakleigh kicked the first two goals of the game. The Stingrays worked the ball into the wind to kick a responded goal and cut the margin. However, in a manner fitting of the afternoon Oakleigh responded with every Stingrays attack to enter quarter time with a 20 point lead. Despite warm and sunny conditions, the wind proved a decisive factor, with the breeze blowing consistently across the ground and advantaging one end. The Chargers were the aggressors early in the second term, kicking goals again, which gave them a game high 30 point lead before the Stingrays once again kept the game in check putting scoreboard pressure on late in the half. At Half time Oakleigh had slightly stretched their lead to 21 points but were dominating the play.

Oakleigh appeared to hold the ascendancy in the third term before the Stingrays slowly pegged back the scoreboard, but entries into the forward half proved the difference on the day, with the Stingrays struggling to score whilst Oakleigh put one through the big sticks nearly every time they entered their inside 50. At the end of the third and chasing down a 46 deficit Stingrays coach Graeme Yeats asked players to take risk, run and hit targets.

The last quarter started in a struggle and with a few workmen like Stingrays goals, which a small belief started to grow in the side that they may be able to run down Oakleigh, but once again the Chargers went forward and opened the game up again and put it beyond doubt and eventually winning by roughly 8 goals.

The game was won and lost in the midfield as the Stingrays fumbled possession and failed to hit forward targets, whilst Key forwards had little impact again making it easier for Oakleigh to rebound and set themselves up.
