Executive Officer's Report

After being offered the position as Executive Officer, commencing late April, I was pleased to once again be part of the lacrosse community. Having been a past player for approximately twenty years and spectator for the last seven, it was great to see many of the people I had grown up with, still heavily involved within the community, and meeting the new generation of lacrosse! It is fantastic to see we are still topping the list of rising lacrosse players Australia wide.

One of the challenges I am facing at present is the number of vacant positions on the Board. In saying this, I understand clubs are in the same situation, the retention of committee members across the community needs to be addressed as a priority. A small sport cannot continue to be sustainable with the absence of these support structures. Throughout the year we had resignations from our Women's Competition Director, State Teams Representative and President, heavily impacting the responsibilities of office staff and board members. We also have vacancies for Development and Promotions Director, two roles of significant importance to any organisation.

There are several items I will be addressing during the off season to ensure clarity and efficiency moving forward, this includes a Club Handbook. The Club Handbook will be designed to further detail the role of Clubs and the Association outlining specific information and guidelines to further assist in the continued preparation of Lacrosse in South Australia. This handbook will provide clarity to existing and new committee members and can be used as a guide.

The major topic on most agenda's these days would have to be recruitment and retention. This is an area that has been highlighted through many conversations since my commencement and would like to see a committee formed with a representative from each club. It's needless to say how astounded I was with the number of transfers submitted to the Association this year and am sure we have broken records with them. We, as a sport, need to come together and strengthen our place in the sport and recreation industry as one whole group to give us more buying power than as individuals – "United we stand, divided we fall". There should be no reason not to share ideas and systems that have and haven't worked as a tool in providing direction for lacrosse in our state.

Director of Finance Report

The following 2 pages are details of the financial statements for the 12 months concluded on 30th September 2014 - prepared on an accruals basis. Accruals basis means income still to be received after 30th September, but relating to the 2013/14 financial year is included (and is shown in debtors in the balance sheet) - and conversely expenses paid after 30th September but relating to the 2013/14 financial year are included (and shown in the balance sheet as creditors).

The "bottom line" shows a \$6,192 deficit for the year. You can analyse from the statements which income or expense items have gone up or down from the previous year, and the major "extraordinary" expense was unused long serve leave and annual leave paid out to the retiring Executive Officer. You may notice the income item fines showing a negative figure - this purely means that there were more fines waived from prior years than were actually imposed in this current year.

The Club debtor amounts shown in the balance sheet were the amounts outstanding as at 30th September. There were amounts billed to Clubs subsequent to 30th September 2014 that related to the 2014 season, so they have been included in sundry debtors (as it is obviously not the Clubs' fault that these were not paid before 30th September). The majority of the total amount in sundry debtors was our annual Office of Rec & Sport grant of \$40,000 not received until October 2014. The "sundry debtors other" total conservatively only includes amounts which have actually been paid since 30th September (plus the bills to the Clubs mentioned above). Also "receipts in advance" is amounts regarding state representative teams (mainly under 15's) paid just prior to 30th September for which the associated expenses against those moneys had not been paid out at that point in time, as well as team nomination fees to be credited/refunded to Clubs that ended up in Women's Div 2 but paid the higher Women's Div 1 team fee.

The sundry creditor amount is mainly referee and umpire payments from the 2014 season which have been paid after 30th September.

Women's Competition Committee Report

As there was not an appointed Director of Women's Competition for most of the season, I chaired the meetings. Thank you to all the Club representatives for their respectful manner and commitment to the WCC.

This season the Div1 and Div2 competitions were combined with the object being to provide a more diverse competition for the clubs which had competed in a 4 team Div1 competition for the past few years. Teams played each other once and then the competition was split with the top 5 teams becoming the Div1 competition and the other 6 teams forming the Div2 competition for the remainder of the season. Although this wasn't ideal for all clubs with some games being one sided, overall most teams improved their skill level which provided closer games in each split division. This was demonstrated by the closeness of finals results. Clubs will need to decide if this format continues for next season or implement another plan to keep the competition improving.

It was agreed to hold a stakeholders' forum (players, coaches, umpires) before the end of the year. To be included on the agenda, but not exclusively;

- Retaining players as they move from juniors into senior competitions
- Strengthening the Div1 competition as a pathway into League
- The continuing relevance of the variance to By law 2.6.1 that allows for a player to play League for another club if their club doesn't have a WSL team.
- Compliancy for senior teams.

I encourage all clubs to be involved and share ideas to keep the competition growing.

Congratulations to Wilderness (League), Adelaide Uni (Div1) and East Torrens Payneham (Div2) on winning 2014 premierships and Brighton (League), Glenelg (Div1) and North Adelaide (Div2) finishing the season as Minor Premiers.

Thank you to Mark Basham for doing the competition draws and Giulia and Tiff arranging any changes.

Thank you to all the players, coaches, umpires, officials for your continuing support of the competition.

Director of Junior Competition Report

I took over the role of Junior Coordinator from Sue Hogan in April of this year so this report covers events from the period of April through to the November AGM.

It was important to spend some time in the initial meeting with the Junior Committee to establish the way in which the committee would operate in terms of communication, critical thinking and the adoption of a broader perspective on the development and management of Junior Competition Events. The following points were agreed upon.

- All discussion & decisions will be informed by deeper levels of thinking and 'evidence' rather than by 'emotion' or by what has been 'past practice'.
- As a group we are committed to develop and grow the sport. This means adopting a perspective which is broader than just 'club based' one which focuses on contributing to the sport overall.
- Our aim is to provide the best opportunities for young people to learn and enjoy Lacrosse & flourish in the sport. Our knowledge the sport, the rules, the progression for learning, the philosophy for junior participation all impact on the experiences structured for children and are significant in promoting enjoyment of lacrosse.

Competition Events

Early in the season the major problem confronting the Junior Committee early was the lack of clarity and guidelines of a number of the junior competition events. This meant competition events looked disorganised and led to questions on rules and other matters.

It was agreed that for the 2015 season:

- Each competition event should be clearly promoted on the website with guidelines for organisation, philosophy and rules well before the season starts. This would allow clubs/ teams to understand fully what they are signing in for and it allows them to solve any issues from the information provided.
- Documentation to be produced clearly outlining the Rule progression across the junior grades (boys and girls) with a rationale providing support information about how this structure supports player development and learning.

Official (umpire/ referee/ bench) & Coach Education:

This was identified as a priority area for sustaining the sport and ensuring competition events for juniors are operated in a safe/positive manner. Several ideas were suggested for collaborating to improve the opportunities for the education of officials/coaches using the Junior Competition events for 2015.

Key Initiatives undertaken during this period

- July 5th Celebration of Lacrosse: Successful Carnival morning using a 5 a side non-contact game.
- Score-line margin (mercy rule) considerations implemented across ALL junior levels of competition.
- Other discussion included Inclement weather policy, Age groupings, Compliancy, Grants for Club Support.

Thank you to the Junior Committee for their contribution, insight and assistance. Stuart Robb, Scott Willsmore, Judy Thurgood, Gavin Wood, Nicolle Pattichis, Kieran Sandow, Kylie Bragg, Marilyn Fuss, John Hill, Kelsey Piltz, Peter Vickery, Natalie Reynolds.

Special thanks to Natalie Clark Reynolds who assisted with minute taking and administrative duties.

Luke Oswald – skilled contribution with fixtures for junior competition events and for the Celebration of Lacrosse. His leadership in the flexible management of fixtures and his key ideas for options with junior development are appreciated.

John Fuss – support with the management of junior events including the Celebration of Lacrosse, for his insight with incident management during the season and his leadership in providing opportunity for junior boys to learn about box lacrosse at the Blackwood Centre on Saturdays evenings in Spring. Work in sourcing mini goals for the Association.

Development Report

As Development Coordinator my achievements for this year are the running of our annual SAPSASA events. The Southern event was held at Sturt Lacrosse Club where we had 550 students in 55 teams from 13 schools. The Northern event was held at the North Adelaide Lacrosse Club where we had 250 students in 23 teams participating from 7 schools. Woodville held a carnival where 200 students in 25 teams from 2 schools attended, Nazareth and Grange Primary. Brighton also held a Catholic carnival with 500 children from 5 local schools. These events are paramount in getting lacrosse out into our schools as schools are where our future lacrosse players will come from, the carnivals are at the end of many clinics being run in the participating schools.

ACHPER also hold sporting carnivals each year during PE week where we get to showcase lacrosse to 10 or more schools from which I have formed friendships with PE teachers and have been given the opportunity revisit their schools to run lacrosse clinics. Tea Tree Gully SAPSASA sporting carnival was another big lacrosse event again this year, where I ran lacrosse clinics for 600 children from 14 schools in an area which is a gold mine for recruiting. I am currently in discussions with the organiser to try and get a mini lacrosse competition in that area during the summer school holidays to raise awareness and recruit.

Our girls game is growing fast, we had 6 teams in each of our U13 div1 and div2 grades, even though we increased the number of players on the field to 10. Our U15 girls had 10 teams and U18 girls had a record number of 7 teams - the more colleges we can get on board with Lacrosse the bigger our sport will grow.

Our Colleges are already preparing for the 2015 season which means they will do the recruiting for us. At this point in time we have Cabra, St Peter' Girls, Seymour Loreto, St Aloysius, and Wilderness all having Lacrosse in their curriculum. St Aloysius is growing again this year, they will be adding U11 teams to the competition as well as their U13's. On a high for the boys, Sacred Heart Middle school is finally adding lacrosse to their Curriculum for 2015 meaning they will enter teams in our term 1 competition hopefully flowing through to the winter competition. Also Blackfriars have just confirmed that they will enter teams in our 2015 winter competition in U11's and possibly U13's. This means not only do they offer Lacrosse as a school sport but the infrastructure is already there. If every club had one or two colleges that they called their own their recruitment would almost take care of itself.

The 2014 High School Competition ended and was run for the boys only this year, with insufficient resources to hold the girls' competition as well. The competition was won by Immanuel College for a second successive year. Next year's School Competition will be expanded in 2015 to include primary school grades as well, from Year 4 and up, with girls' teams returning, and all matches played at Park 21W in the city. We need the support and hard work of every club to make sure there are sufficient teams in this competition to ensure its success.

Lacrosse was added this year to the "Caica Cup" event – a multi-sport one-day carnival between Henley High School and St Michael's College and named for the local member of parliament. A mixed 5-a-side match was played between the two schools with a tight tussle resulting in victory to St Michael's. With juniors from the Glenelg and Woodville Lacrosse Clubs attending both schools, "mate against mate", it was fantastic to see the match played in great spirits but also to a high standard, and we should no doubt see lacrosse remain in the Caica Cup program for years to come. Thanks to Stuart Robb for officiating the match!

The Comets team, consisting of lacrosse players from IGSSA schools, participated in their second national u15 tournament this year. With the tournament having been played in Perth, and once again being a competitive unit, it showed that the Comets have the pool of players to be able to participate both home and interstate. The Comets have shown that they will be an ongoing representative team from SA in the national tournament.

The University lacrosse development program continued in 2014, with the annual SA Challenge lacrosse trophy won by Flinders University who played a one-off match against Adelaide Uni and defeated them by a goal. A national university 5-a-side lacrosse tournament was held alongside the traditional Intervarsity field lacrosse matches between Adelaide and Melbourne University Lacrosse Clubs in October. The 5-a-side tournament was also won by Flinders who defeated Melbourne Uni 6-3 to take out national honours as well. Flinders Uni are also entered in this year's iLax competition and it is good to see the development of this program outside of the traditional lacrosse system.

I believe that the backbone of our sport is our juniors and I am passionate about recruiting more juniors in 2015. I have thoroughly enjoyed my role this past year and look forward to the challenges in the year to come.
