Youth (U13-U19): Secondary School-aged children, 13-19 years. Develop player potential, enhance team skills and foster competitive spirit and desirable attitudes through training and match play.

1. To recognise the significant contribution of coaches to the conduct and development of Australian Football in Victoria and in particular in the Oakleigh Region

2. To recognise the achievements of coaches who give quality service to the game in that they:

- 2.1 Display strength of character in the role of coaching
- 2.2 Foster enthusiasm for, interest in, and an excellent attitude to participation in football
- 2.3 Give quality value to the goals and purposes of Club and League football.
