Mrs Judy Otto (PLW) received the 2017 Women & Sport Award for Oceania. Congratulations Judy!
As President of the Palau Swimming Association, Judy has played a key role in advocating women's sports participation within her country. She developed a water aerobics program and a year round learn- to-swim program for schools and rural communities. In addition, she has worked to support and enhance commitment to health and active living for both men and women in the local communities.

New IOC Member for Oceania.

At the recent IOC Session in Lima, Baklai Temengil (PLW) was elected a member of the IOC. Earlier this year, Baklai became the first women elected Vice-President of ONOC (indeed of any Continental Association). Baklai is Palau NOC Secretary-General, Minister of Community & Cultural Affairs for Palau; Member of ANOC Executive and Treasurer, Palau Canoe Association. In addressing the UN she said: "Women are powerful agents of change. And gender equality and women's empowerment have a transformative and multiplier effect on sustainable development"

Baklai was the inaugural Chair of the ONOC Women & Sport Commission. She is an inspiration to us all!
